So I would anticipate 18 that to be done, when I say shortly, I mean relatively. 19 There's probably 100 files or so amongst all of them, 20 and I would anticipate that the adjustors, with their 21 workloads and everything, would be able to get through 22 those within 45 to 60 days, and we could have a report 23 for Laurie on those. 24 With respect to Continental Casualty, the
